

Questions to ask the SRPD about FLOCK Cameras

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1. Will SRPD adopt Flock's new seven-day standard? If not, why does Santa Rosa need to keep vehicle location data for 30 days?
2. When Evidence Mode is used, exactly what is preserved, for how long, and who decides what qualifies?
3. Of the 730,456 unique vehicle detections reported in the last 30 days, how many were connected to an actual criminal investigation?
4. Of the 39,996 hotlist hits reported in the last 30 days, how many were confirmed matches?
5. How many outside law enforcement agencies can access or search what Santa Rosa's cameras collect?
6. When an officer from another agency searches Santa Rosa's data, whose rules apply: SRPD's, their own agency's, or both?
7. If another agency uses Santa Rosa's data in its own investigation, can it keep that information after SRPD's retention period ends?
8. What prevents an agency with access from using Santa Rosa's data for a purpose SRPD itself prohibits?
9. How many improper Flock searches has SRPD identified, investigated, or disciplined?
10. How many searches produced a useful investigative lead, set against the volume of data collected?
